#### **1. Feedback from the 2018 network meeting**

All participants had a very positive experience at the two-day meeting in Giessen. Several presentations were made and the group had lively discussions about a number of topics concerning individual research but also community interests- most notably related to quality criteria (ie validity) in video research. All members enjoyed the shared work with video data, to discuss matters in context.

#### **2. Organisation of the invited SIG symposium at the Bologna conference 2019**

Members agreed

- to hold another symposium

- confirmed ESERA regulations that this needed to include a min of 3 countries/max 4 presentations

- the focus of the symposium will be on validity

A draft for the special call will be prepared (Andreas Vorholzer) and circulated to the network coordinators and the attendees of the network meeting in Gießen so it can be published in a timely manner.

#### **3. Encouraging colleagues from Southern Europe to join the SIG/ESERA**

The network members discussed how to support ESERA's aim to raise the number of colleagues joining the association and the network from currently underrepresented countries in Southern Europe. The following strategies were identified: Shoulder tapping personal contacts and networks; suggesting strong advertising at the next conference in Bologna; to hold one of the next SIG meetings in Southern Europe.

#### **4. Book project**

Maja Brückmann as one of the editors reported that the book project was in progress but had experienced delays for a number of (good) reasons. The editors have a strategy in mind for the next steps of the writing process.
