

## **ESERA SIG Report 2018: Science Identities SIG**

Below we have listed the main activities of the Science Identities SIG for the 2017-2018 period:

- We have submitted a book proposal to Springer for an edited collection on ‘Science Identities’ that will foreground both research within our SIG field and the contributions of SIG members. The proposal has been approved, and we are currently working on some revisions, guidelines and a timeframe for all authors.
- We are in the process of organising a SIG symposium for the 2019 ESERA Conference. The session title will be: "Engaging with issues of culture and power within science identities research". We have invited presenters specifically in order to attract a diversity of speakers, an agenda that we support and sympathize with.
- At the ESERA 2019 we will be organising a business meeting for SIG members as well as a social event for new researchers.
- We have appointed an early career SIG ambassador, Annemie Struyf from University of Antwerpen
